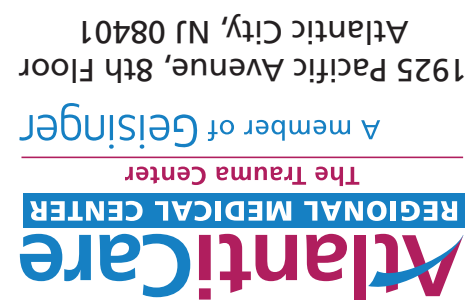
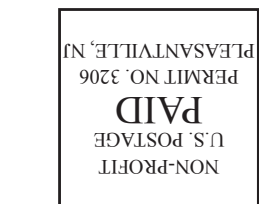

## COURSE INTRODUCTION

### COURSE OVERVIEW

The AtlantiCare Regional Medical Center 22<sup>nd</sup> Annual Trauma Symposium, will address the latest advances and topics in trauma, critical care and emergency medicine, while emphasizing the importance of quality patient care.
